

#### Friends of God Gone Fishin': Discipleship & Calling

- Friends of God: as followers and leaders; as disciplers and callers
- We need not be perfect to come to God; rather, we need to trust God and let him do his gracious work in transforming our lives.



#### Luke 5:1-11

<sup>1</sup> One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret, the people were crowding around him and listening to the word of God.

 <sup>2</sup> He saw at the water's edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets.

 <sup>3</sup> He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then he sat down and taught the people from the boat.

#### Luke 5:1-11

<sup>4</sup>When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch."

<sup>5</sup>Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets."

<sup>6</sup> When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break. <sup>7</sup>So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them, and they came and filled both boats so full that they began to sink.

#### Luke 5:1-11

- <sup>8</sup> When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus' knees and said, "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!" <sup>9</sup> For he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken, <sup>10</sup> and so were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, Simon's partners.
- Then Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people." <sup>11</sup>So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed him.

## Unpacking Luke 5:1-11

#### The Scene

- Jesus
- The listening crowd
- Businessmen bystanders (SimJoJam Fishing Co)
- Simon (Peter) in spotlight
- The Action
  - Preaching on-shore and off-shore
  - Openness of Simon to invitation #1 and #2 of Christ
- The Reaction
  - A physical miracle
  - A metaphysical/spiritual miracle

#### 5 truths from Luke 5:1-11

- 1. A fishing expedition promising a great catch brings in its first catch (of fish and of disciples).
- 2. Sinners are transformed in ordinary circumstances into servants of God (a transforming call to discipleship).
- 3. We need an openness, and generally an invitation, to receive Christ's call and treasure.
- 4. Sometimes we might recognize the call of Christ and still resist by attempting (a) to run away or (b) to rely on our own or others' strength.
- 5. A call from Christ has the ripple effect (Christ's call was to Peter, but all those who experience the catch follow Jesus).
